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**State plans to rewrite mobile home park rules
WVHI is at the table on your behalf in this effort**

The state of West Virginia is planning a rewrite of the mobile home rules and regulations first put into state law in the early 1970s.

The West Virginia Housing Institute Inc., which represents mobile home park owners in the state, will play an important role in making suggestions on what modifications should be made to the existing rules and what should be enacted in the future.

Kevin Wilfong of Fairmont, a mobile home park owner and the co-president of WVHI, has a seat on the state Department of Health task force that has begun work on reviewing and rewriting the rules.

Wilfong has asked for the broadest support and input from mobile home park owners as he represents the community owners in this effort.

This is the first major attempt to rewrite these rules since their enactment.

No one knows at this point what changes will be suggested, what modifications will be made, or when the final rules will be adopted. But this is your opportunity to take part in this important matter that will affect you and all of your community members.

We encourage you to join WVHI and share your recommendations, concerns and suggestions with Wilfong on your behalf so he can address them as your voice to the task force.
