New manufacturer and retailer approved by State Board

State manufactured housing regulators approved licenses Friday to a new manufacturer, retailer and four contractors to do business in West Virginia.

Issued licenses by the West Virginia Manufactured Housing Construction and Safety Standards Board were: manufacturer Adventure Homes LLC of Garrett, Ind., which had been licensed until 2014; and retailer Middletown Home Sales Inc., for a retail lot in New Martinsville, which makes four locations for the state's largest independent retailer headquartered in White Hall, Marion County.

Contractors licenses approved by the State Board included: Danny Kelly Jr., doing business as Living Mobile Home Center of Ripley; Alpha Concepts Inc. of Leon, Mason County; Quinn Electrical Services LLC of Charleston; and Callaway & Corrigan Excavating LLC of Barboursville.

The State Board levied fines totaling \$650 against 14 companies that failed to provide the state with information about their business activity during the previous quarter.

The State Board submitted two repair jobs to the state's recovery fund, a pool of money voluntarily created by the industry to pay for completion of work on homes where either the manufacturer or retailer has gone out of business before the work was completed. The fund has \$1.5 million.

The work was approved for Nancy A. Miller of Brenton, Wyoming County; and Derek and Jennifer Shrewsbury of Odd, Raleigh County. The retailer they dealt with has gone out of business.

The panel's next meeting was tentatively set for June 22.
